March Program: "The National Road-Old Cumberland Pike"

On March 26, 2009, the OHS will be hosting "The National Road-Old Cumberland Pike" program, presented by Ed Hermann. The program introduces the conditions on the American frontier in the 1740s and 1750s, which provided Congress the reason for selecting Cumberland, Maryland, as the starting point of the National Road fifty years later. Mr. Hermann goes on to talk about how the road was surveyed and reasons for the route from Maryland through Pennsylvania and into Wheeling, West Virginia. Historical inns, taverns, monuments, towns, political involvement, artifacts, and unusual traveling experiences are covered. A copy of American History Questions will be provided, giving participants a chance to see if they can recall facts given during the presentation and ask follow up questions.
